His successes also include obtaining a full acquittal for Marine at General Courts-Martial facing over 50 years of confinement and up to 25 specifications and obtaining no basis determinations for multiple service members at Administrative Separation Boards, resulting in their retention in the United States Marine Corps.

Currently, Brett continues to serve as a Civil Affairs officer in the United States Marine Corps Reserve. While earning his law degree at the University of San Diego, Brett was involved with the Journal of Climate & Energy Law and served as the Publicity Chair for the school's Military Bar Association.
